QUEEN'S BATON RELAY RESOURCE PACK

INTRODUCTION TO THE PACK

The Queen's Baton Relay begins in October 2021 and is an important tradition in the lead up to the Commonwealth Games. This resource pack is designed to bring the celebrations alive for your Reception year pupils.

AIMS OF THE PACK

The pack aims to provide learning opportunities to be explored within the classroom. Pupils will be encouraged to explore the Queen's Baton Relay and Commonwealth Games through age appropriate themed activities

HOW TO USE IT

The Queen's Baton Relay in 2022 will last 294 days, finishing in Birmingham on the 28th July 2022 for the Commonwealth Games Opening Ceremony. The activities in this pack can be used throughout this time to engage pupils in this historic occasion. Each activity can standalone so you can use the resources as and when you wish over the 42 weeks to help track the Baton and its progress.

The activities in these resources range in length and can therefore be selected to fit into learning schedules to suit your timetables. There are printable resources making it quick and easy to plan and enhance topic learning.

INTRODUCTION TO BIRMINGHAM 2022 AND THE QUEEN'S BATON RELAY

Welcome to Birmingham 2022! It is time to begin introducing your pupils to this fantastic event. The Commonwealth Games take place every 4 years and sees 72 different nations and territories come together not only to compete but to meet and inspire each other to work towards greater achievements.

In the run up to the Commonwealth Games there is the incredible Queen's Baton Relay. It begins in Buckingham Palace complete with a message from the Queen. The uniquely designed Baton will travel around all of the Commonwealth nations and territories over 294 days before arriving at the opening ceremony. Use the following activities and worksheets to introduce your pupils to these historic events.

THE BIRMINGHAM 2022 BATON

The most important element of the Relay is of course the Baton, without it the event would not be possible. Below is a picture of the unique design created for Birmingham 2022, share this with your pupils and explain that during the relay it is passed from person to person as they travel the world.



Open a discussion into the Baton. Ask your class what they like about it? Can they describe the Baton and it's colours? Did they know it features a camera to record the journey, can track the holder's heart rate and has an amazing colour changing lighting display. Most importantly the baton holds a message from Queen Elizabeth II herself. In the 2022 Baton, it is hidden in a chamber at the top of the Baton, under the golden logo.



Now the class has seen the Birmingham 2022 Baton, you may also wish to show them some images of other batons. Here is a selection from some previous relays.





THE BATON'S JOURNEY

The Queen's Baton Relay will last 294 days and travel to all the Commonwealth nations and territories. Below you can find the schedule for the route from October 2021 - January 2022. You may wish to show this to your class and use it as a tool to discuss months of the year or days of the week, to help link to other topic teaching.

Following this are a selection of resources related to the baton and its journey:

- The Batons Journey Developing pencil control skills.
- Baton Keywords Introducing some key words related to the relay and letter formation.
- **Read and Write** This shows the process of the Queen's Baton Relay going on its journey. Focusing on letter formation and reading skills.
- Make Your Own Baton Exploring art and design, allowing your class to explore creativity.
- **The Queen's Message** An activity which explores both drawing and letter formation, while introducing the message from the Queen which is vital to the traditions of the event.
- **Build your Batonbearer** The Baton is carried by thousands of Batonbearers around the commonwealth, colour in and create your own batonbearer puppet.
- The Batons Journey 2 seeing if your pupils can complete the alphabet.





MAKE A BATON

In this arts and crafts activity your class will be making their own Baton. Many actual baton designs focus on the environment and sustainability, for example the 2018 Gold Coast Baton was made using sustainable macadamia wood and recycled plastic which was collected from the oceans, waterways and beaches around the Gold Coast, in a project to reduce pollution. You can use this as a discussion opportunity with your class, to explore how they can help our planet and why they would want to do so.

Use kitchen roll tubes and other recycled materials to design and create their own baton. They can develop dexterity through cutting and sticking on their designs. Record their work by photographing everyone with their finished batons.










THE COMMONWEALTH FLAG


THIS IS THE COMMONWEALTH OF NATIONS FLAG. IT'S CURRENT DESIGN DATES TO 2013. IT FEATURES THE COMMONWEALTH SYMBOL IN GOLD ON A BLUE BACKGROUND. THE SYMBOL INCLUDES A RADIAL GRATING FORMING THE LETTER 'C' SURROUNDING A CIRCULAR SOLID, ON WHICH ARE SUPERIMPOSED FIVE LATIDUNIAL LINES AND FIVE LONGITUDINAL LINES TO REPRESENT THE GLOBE.




















BATON RELAY

Host your own Baton Relay event. Begin by fully warming up as a class. Set a course in your school hall or field either as a loop or backwards and forwards along a track. Split the class into even teams and explain the rules. A relay consists of shorter sprinting sections, before passing the baton on to your next team mate, who will then sprint and pass it on again. This pattern continues to the finish line.

Have your relay race and afterwards discuss the event. How did they find it? What was difficult and what was easy?

The Birmingham 2022 Games are hugely important for the legacy of the city, it is providing opportunities for local people, celebrating diversity and uniting communities across the region.


The Commonwealth nation and territories has a combined population of more than 2 billion, of which more than 60% are under 30 years of age. One of the main aims of the Commonwealth Games Federation is improving the chances of the Commonwealth's young people. Birmingham 2022's Games will also follow this goal to champion the youth and inspire them to accomplish their goals.

Ask your class to consider what they would like to do in their future. Get them to draw a picture of them in the future and ask them to describe what they imagine will happen.

Whatever their goals are, they should be looked at positively and encouraged to be ambitious in meeting them. In their journey through life there will be many different paths and choices, some of it is not easy. No matter what, encourage your class to remember that the most important thing is to be happy.
